***The interdisciplinary minor in Native American Studies requires a minimum of 28 credits, with at least 16 upper-division credits. Students must fulfill distribution requirements, taking at least one class each from the following groups:***

- Group I: Culture, Language & Education
- Group II: Law, Policy, Governance, & History
- Group III: Literature, Media & the Arts

One class counting toward the minor must be focused on ***\*Oregon Indians***
